Welcome to the latest edition of the Haughton Parish Council Newsletter. Since the last newsletter a year ago there have been changes to the way the parish council works and our accountability. We also wish to get some ideas for the telephone box and also for additional recreational facilities.

COUNCIL CHANGES

New Clerk

As you will be aware from the last newsletter, Lisa Horritt joined as our clerk in September 2016. Unfortunately, for personal reasons, she left us at the end of December 2017. This left us with a gap until we managed to recruit a new clerk, Susan Atkins, at the end of March 2018. Susan is a recently retired school teacher, but in the past was clerk to Wheaton Aston Parish Council. Unlike our previous two clerks she is not a clerk for any other parish. Susan has several friends and relatives in Haughton and is therefore up to date with what the village activities are.

New Parish Councillor

As you may have noticed, the Bell Inn has been closed since September. This is because Alison and Richard, the tenants, have moved to another pub out of the village. As Alison was a parish councillor this left a vacancy and, after due consideration, Stuart Taylor has been co-opted onto the parish council to serve until the elections in May 2019. Stuart will be known to those of you who are involved in the BKV litter picks as a regular volunteer. He is also very active in the local Rotary Club and brings considerable volunteering experience to the council.

What we are spending this year

The parish precept is the amount of money the parish council collects from each household via the community charge. This year, in keeping with many parishes, the precept has had to increase due to the extra activities we need to take on, (e.g. looking after some of the Rights of Way footpaths around the village), and the increased regulations that have come into force, all of which affects our administration costs. We also need to replace the matting under the children's play equipment in the next four years, at a cost of around £10,000. To do this we have moved some money from our reserves, and need to save the remainder over the next four years.

War Memorial



As part of the commemorations for the centenary of the First World War the Parish Council obtained funding from the War Memorials Trust Grants Scheme and Staffordshire County Council's Community Fund so that the village's memorial to the eleven men who died in the First World War and the one man who died in the Second World War could be cleaned and restored to something like its original condition. The restoration work was completed in October 2016, in time for the Remembrance Day commemorations.

Following the cleaning, the possibility of listing the memorial as a building of Special Architectural or Historic Interest was considered, and it was decided by the Parish Council to begin the process, to ensure a high level of protection for the memorial in years to come. Research was begun, using parish records and printed sources of the time, to produce verified historical facts, information and details. This process was still on-going when we were approached by Historic England, who had seen information and pictures of the memorial on War Memorials Online and had decided to begin the listing process themselves. As part of the consultation we gave them our gathered information and this was used to help with the listing application. In January 2018 we received the Notification of Designation Decision. Haughton War Memorial has been added to the List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest and is listed at Grade II. The List Entry Number is 1452622.

Phone Box



The Parish Council has taken advantage of BT's Adopt-a-Kiosk scheme, which means that for the initial cost of £1 the distinctive red K6 telephone box can remain in its prominent position in the centre of the village. The Parish Council is now inviting views as to its usage, before a final decision is made. Many towns and villages have adopted their kiosks and there have been some imaginative uses. One popular use is to house a defibrillator, (although Haughton already has four defibrillators: at The Bell, The Shropshire, the shops and inside the Village Hall). Ideas and suggestions so far include a book exchange, an information point, a book and information point, an art gallery, a display-house for a monthly or seasonal dressed mannequin, (e.g. Father Christmas, Guy Fawkes), or a wi-fi point for the village.

It is hoped to set up a Working Group to complete any necessary restoration and maintenance work and that funding will be available from grants to carry out any work. If you are interested in being part of the Working Group, please email the clerk, clerk@haughton-pc.org.uk giving your contact details and expertise/interest. To suggest uses for the phone box email the clerk quoting Telephone Kiosk use. Suggestions will close at the end of July 2018.

Money for further recreational Facilities

When new properties are built in an area Stafford Borough Council receives some money from the developer to cover the increased services needed in that area. As the Redfern Rise development has been recently completed there is money available from the borough council to improve the recreational facilities in Haughton. The parish council has put forward some initial ideas, some of which are acceptable, and some of which the borough thinks are not.

We have suggested

- A) to spend money enhancing Grassy Lane.
- B) To add extra play equipment to the playing field.
- C) To put the money towards building changing rooms at the playing field.
- D) To complete the tarmacking on the Village Hall Car Park. (Alas, the borough council does not consider this to be recreational.)

Whatever we do has to be supported by the village community, so we are asking you for your comments on the existing ideas and also to add any new ideas you have.
