New Councillor Following the resignation of a Councillor, the Parish Council followed instructions provided by the Elections Office of Stafford Borough Council and have co-opted a new Councillor. The Parish Council welcomes Jane Woodcock to the team of seven Councillors.

Haughton's Annual Parish Assembly took place on 27th September. Forty-three members of the public attended for discussions on the results of the Parish Survey and concerns about speeding vehicles passing through the village. Invited guests to assist with the

discussions were Cllr. Mark Winnington, Helen Fisher - Deputy Commissioner for Police, Fire and Rescue & Crime, Mark Keeling – Strategic Community Infrastructure Manager, Staffs County Council and Mel Langdown from Safer Roads Partnership. A number of questions were raised from members of the public including safety at the playing field and public rights of way issues. Discussions took place around the various possible traffic calming measures which could be implemented.

Community Speedwatch As part of the Annual Assembly discussions on speeding traffic the Community Speedwatch campaign was raised. It was agreed to re-instigate this activity and the meeting was told that training will be given to volunteers. Helen Fisher and Cllr Winnington volunteered to attend a group session when the scheme is up and running. **Volunteers are needed!** Our Co-ordinator is Andy White.
